WHAT IS CSA?

CSA stands for "Community Supported Agriculture". It is simply an agreement in which you purchase a share in our garden. Your share provides a portion of the farm expenses, including labor and the purchase of seeds and supplies. In return, you'll receive 23 weekly baskets of seasonal produce from our garden. Think of it as owning a garden, but not having to pull the weeds!



WHAT WE GROW

Early Season:

strawberries, lettuce, spinach, radishes, scallions, salad greens, cauliflower, kale, broccoli, peas, beets, fennel, and more...

Mid-Season:

blueberries, black raspberries, lettuce, squash, garlic, cucumbers, carrots, onions, beans, corn, cantaloupe, leeks, potatoes, watermelon, herbs, and more...

Late Season:

lettuce, tomatoes, sweet potatoes, peppers, pumpkins, turnips, cauliflower, collards, butternut squash, salad greens, broccoli, and more...

CSA shares are distributed for 23 weeks, beginning in May. A share is a half-bushel basket containing enough produce for approximately 4 people, depending on your eating and cooking habits.

Weekly Half-shares are also available, designed for smaller families. Along with your produce, you will receive an email newsletter with recipes, farm news, and tips on how to use and store your produce.
